

Coachella & Stagecoach Continue to Reinvent Festival Fever

Whether you attend the Coachella and/or Stagecoach festivals or own a business that benefits from all the festival attendees in town, there is a lot to look forward to as festival fever sets in. Coachella runs April 15-17 and April 22-24, and Stagecoach will be held April 29-May 1 – all at the Empire Polo Club in Indio.

Goldenvoice continues to enhance the festivals by adding new features that keep attendees coming back for more. And the bigger the festivals get, the better things get for business. A 2012-13 Economic Impact Analysis published by Development Management Group revealed that the festivals provided an economic impact to the regional economy of \$254.42 million dollars in a single year.

Venturing Virtual

This year, the experience will be beefed up for festival-goers with new virtual reality programming. A new app and a custom Google

Cardboard headset were included in their wristband 'Welcome Boxes.'

The Coachella VR app allows Cardboard and Gear VR owners to flip through 360-degree photos from past festivals and access interviews and performances from this year's artists. It also provides a virtual tour of the festival grounds.

Festival-goers can also turn their body in a circular motion and see scenes such as the Coachella poster or the festival panorama. The app will be regularly updated with new content up to the festival's first weekend.

Going Gourmet

For the third year, Goldenvoice has invited Outstanding in the Field to amp up the dining experience. This pop-up dinner crew creates locally-focused, elaborate meals in places such as beaches, farms and rooftop balconies.

Outstanding in the Field will feature three chefs cooking both seatings per night, many of whom are nationally recognized. There are two dinners per night for all six days of the festival. The 18 chefs cooking at the festival have some level of name recognition in the culinary world.



Corralling Country

Country fans continue to come to Stagecoach
Festival in droves, making it Southern California's
premier country music festival. Beyond the biggest
stars in country music, Stagecoach offers festival fun
that includes the air-conditioned Honky-tonk Dance
Hall, the Half Pint Hootenanny for kids, and the
opportunity to see Budweiser's Clydesdales live.
The Goldenvoice festivals bring a unique brand

Scientists and many athletes have known for years, of course, that a cup of coffee before a workout jolts athletic performance, especially in endurance sports.

7. Coffee can reduce your risk of developing Type 2 diabetes.

Researchers found that people who drink 4 or more cups a day reduce their chances of developing Type 2 diabetes by 50%.

8. Drinking coffee could help keep your brain healthier for longer.

Researchers found that people older than 65 who had higher blood levels of caffeine developed Alzheimer's disease two to four years later than others with lower caffeine.

9. Smelling coffee could make you less stressed.

Researchers examined the brains of rats who were stressed with sleep deprivation and discovered that those who were exposed to coffee aromas experienced changes in brain proteins tied to that stress.

10. Coffee could reduce your chances of getting skin cancer (if you're a woman).

Brigham & Women's Hospital followed 112,897 men and women over a 20-year period and women who drank three or more cups of coffee a day were much less likely to develop skin cancer than those who didn't.

11. Coffee may make you more intelligent.

A jolt from coffee not only keeps you awake, it make you sharper. Coffee allows your brain to work in a much more efficient and smarter way.

CITY MANAGER'S MESSAGE



Committee Weighs in on La Quinta's Future

La Quinta has seen such a surge of activity in the past few weeks as we welcomed thousands of

visitors for another successful *La Quinta Arts Festival* as well as the *BNP Paribas Open*. The businesses certainly appreciate the additional foot traffic, and the exposure La Quinta receives helps feed its tourism industry – which ultimately is beneficial for the entire community.

At the recent La Quinta Chamber of Commerce State of the City Mayor's Luncheon, we received a comprehensive update from the mayor and members of the City Council. We learned that through a 25% reduction in workforce, efficiencies through a restructured organization and cost-cutting measures in operations, the City has been able overcome a deficit that began following the state's elimination of redevelopment agencies – which resulted in a \$63 million annual loss for La Quinta.

We heard how the City is continuing to focus on the priorities that make La Quinta great – including infrastructure improvements, public safety, outstanding facilities and recreational opportunities such as well-maintained hiking and biking trails.

The mayor and city council also shared the challenges facing La Quinta in the coming years. Projected revenue will not be enough to cover the increasing public safety costs, and the City would need to deplete reserves in order to uphold the standard of public safety that the community has come to expect and appreciate. A 14-member citizen's advisory committee has recommended that a measure go to the voters on this November's ballot to present a proposed increase in sales tax from 8 percent

to 9 percent. The committee reviewed the City's financial reports in depth over the past 6 months and concluded that the City could be looking at a \$50 million deficit in the 10 years if something isn't done to increase revenues.

It is now time for the La Quinta stakeholders to decide. In the coming months there will be much debate regarding our financial future. Some have stated that the path forward should entail cutting staff and all non-public safety activities. Others have stated that increasing revenue through a tax measure is the prudent option since much efficiency has been realized through past cost cutting initiatives. The beauty is that the community will now determine what path the City takes.

The City of La Quinta remains dedicated to keeping this community the Gem of the Desert, and we will continue to keep residents apprised of what's happening to plan for our future. If you would like to sign up for our email newsletter to stay informed, please go to **La-Quinta.org.**

Safety Tips to Keep in Mind

The La Quinta Police Department works every day to ensure your safety, but there are things you can do to help:

- Always keep doors and windows locked. Install dead-bolt locks on all doors.
- Keep your home well lit at night, inside and out.
- Install a peephole in your front door so you can see the person before you open the door.
- Ask for proper identification from deliverymen or strangers. Don't be afraid of asking if they are legitimate, they won't mind.

- If a stranger asks to use your telephone, offer to place the call for him/her yourself. Never let a stranger into your home.
- Do not leave notes on your door when you are gone, and do not hide your keys under the mat.
- Never give out information over the phone indicating that you are alone or that you won't be home at a certain time.
- When you are gone for more than a day, make sure your home looks and sounds occupied - use automatic timers to turn on lights.
- Never give any personal information over the telephone, this includes: bank information, credit card numbers or social security numbers.

Notice From the Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District

The Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District has issued a notice of intent to apply aquatic larvacides

and adulticides for vector control as part of the District's Integrated Vector Management program.

This notification covers District control measures from March 1 – December 31 as needed for the suppression of vector populations and arbovirus transmission when non-chemical strategies aren't feasible.

Application of mosquito control products will be made throughout the Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District by Ultra Low Volume (ULV) and barrier adulticide applications and Larvaciding applications.

Applications are made based on key vector and arbovirus surveillance indicators. All pesticide labeling requirements are complied with during application of vector control products.

Welcome Renters: What You Need to Know Renting in the City of La Quinta

April is a busy month for vacation rentals in La Quinta with all the festivals and events happening in the area. If your La Quinta property is a vacation rental, here are some things your renters should know so that their stay can be a positive experience not only for them, but for your neighbors and surrounding La Quinta residents, as well.

Renters are advised that all rules will be strictly enforced. Failure to comply may result in a citation, fines, and/or expulsion from the rented property. City residents have the right to call a short-term vacation rental hotline to report violations of the rules outlined in this brochure.

NOISE: Please keep any music to an appropriate level. Remember you are renting in a residential neighborhood. The surrounding neighbors have access to a 24/7 hotline that they may call to file a complaint. The homeowner or an appointed agent will be expected to respond to any complaint within 45 minutes or the La Quinta Police Department will be called.

TRASH: Rental properties should be kept clean with no visible trash. Please keep all trash containers out of street view.

PARKING: Onsite parking is limited to approved carports, garages, and driveways. Renter's vehicles should not block a neighbor's driveway. Additional vehicles should be parked directly in front of the rental property. Keep in mind you are renting in a neighborhood.



STEM Education: A Focus on Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics

Science/Technology/Engineering/
Mathematics (STEM) education has
recently been a hot topic, as politicians
and business leaders worry over the
lack of qualified workers in science and
engineering. Although much discussion
focuses on higher education and high
school curriculum, educators and others
are realizing that for students to really get
hooked on the sciences, STEM instruction
must start early.

Traditionally, students hit the books to find information but may not have opportunities to apply it to real-world experiences. A STEM education breaks that tradition, engaging students with the course material as an incentive to dig deeper, conduct research, and apply learning in relevant contexts. When students understand the advantages of STEM education and how active learning applies to the world and their lives, when they make discoveries that put theory into action—eyes are opened to an array of opportunities.

Two exciting new magnet schools are about to open in the La Quinta beginning in the 2016-2017 school year. With a new emphasis comes a fresh "rebranding" as the schools consider names that announce their transformation. Current frontrunners are, Discovery STEM Academy: La Quinta (grades 6-8) and Discovery STEM Academy: Truman (grades K-5). These free public schools will approach teaching and learning using a STEM philosophy including:

- Grounding STEM education in "real life" problems
- Student participation in original research projects
- Student internships and mentorship with STEM professionals

In general, studies show that specialized STEM schools make a difference. Their graduates pursue STEM fields in college at a rate of nearly 50% higher than that of other students. Compared with the national average, nearly 20% more



selective STEM graduates earn a STEM-related postsecondary degree within four years of high school graduation. *source:* successfulstemeducation.org

STEM is not just for scientists any more. In today's economy, almost any job with decent pay requires STEM skills, and many require advanced STEM abilities. Far too many U.S. residents are unprepared for today's occupational demands. Formerly a world leader in math and science, the United States is struggling to keep up. The lack of knowledge undermines the nation's economic productivity and global competiveness.

STEM academies respond to this challenge by offering rigorous curricula, uniquely trained and prepared teachers, more hands-on experiences, and state-of-the-art resources. These schools will be a beacon for other schools seeking to encourage young people to become the innovators, educators, researchers, and leaders who can solve the most pressing challenges facing our nation and our world.

The Top Myths About Income Taxes

Below is a partial list of the top myths regarding income taxes that I have heard in the last month. Using humor and common sense, I have attempted to summarize and paraphrase short answers. If further explanation is needed, Google it or contact your tax advisor.

1. The IRS makes all the tax laws.

INCORRECT: The IRS, as well as other tax agencies, enforce the laws passed by elected officials. If you are still asking why taxes are such and such, contact your elected representative.

- 2. You do not have to pay taxes after a certain age. INCORRECT: If you have taxable income, you will pay taxes until you die (and in some cases even after you die). This is commonly confused with social security earnings limits.
- 3. You didn't receive a 1099 so you don't have to claim it.

INCORRECT: As a U.S. Citizen, you are required to report all worldwide income, regardless of whether or not you received a 1099 or not.

4. You can claim an allowance for charitable contributions.

INCORRECT: There is no "allowance" or whatever the IRS allows. Cash/check/

credit card donations must be listed in detail. Donations to organizations such as Goodwill must provide greater detail (and is a high audit area). That \$500 bag of old clothes? Prove it.

5. You can settle your taxes for pennies on the dollar.

INCORRECT: Only if you are unemployed or homeless (and even then the IRS will classify your account as Currently Not Collectible). There are specific guidelines that determine what an Offer-in-Compromise will be settled for. Also, there will be what I like to call "house arrest" stipulations that could be worse than the OIC.


6. Loan Payoffs are deductible for capital gains calculations.

INCORRECT: Loans repayments are not deductible. To calculate gain or loss of assets, in most cases the formula is Sales Price minus Expenses of Sale minus Purchase Price minus Improvements (verifiable).

Business Personal Property Tax

It's that time of year when businesses will be receiving notices from county tax assessors requesting a business personal property tax return to be filed (also known as Form 571-L).

While many businesses are accustomed to filing Form 571-L, new business owners are often uninformed as to what this return is, whether they need to file, or when the return is due.



The California

Revenue and tax code permits the taxation of all property, both real and personal. Businesses that have personal property used in day-to-day operations are, therefore, required to report property annually to the county in which the business operates. A business owner may be subject to filing multiple business personal property tax returns if there is more than one business location.

Businesses are subject to the filing requirement when they receive a Business Personal Property Statement from the county assessor. Businesses are also required to file on your own accord (without notice from county assessor) when the value of business personal property equals or exceeds \$100,000.

Depending on what county the business is located in, this form must be paper filed or electronically filed by April 1. Penalties will incur if the return is not filed and received by the county by close-of-business on May 7. However, if May 7 falls on a weekend

or observed holiday, the return will be considered timely filed if received by the close of the next business day.

Assets subject to assessment include all personal property owned as of January 1 of each year. Some of the more common assets subject to tax include, but are not limited to,

machinery and equipment, office furniture and computers. Certain items such as vehicles licensed with the California Department of Motor Vehicles, application software, and solar panels are exempt from reporting. It is important to clearly

distinguish these assets on your books and records to avoid inadvertent assessment.

Once the return is submitted, the county assesses a property tax based on the information provided and will send a notice of tax due. Most tax rates range from 1% to 1.25% based on the location of the property.

It is also important to make sure disposed, sold or abandoned assets are removed from your records prior to filing to avoid any assessments on any assets that are no longer is existence.

Budgeting Healthcare

In the last few years, many of us have become much better at being informed consumers when it comes to our healthcare. It can be hard to predict what you will spend in a year in out-of-pocket costs, but there are some steps you can take to reduce your exposure. First, here are the basic terms you should know about your health insurance plan choices.

Premium: This is the amount you pay per month for your health insurance plan. If you are on Medicare, this can be a combination of 3 different plans. Medicare A and B, Medicare Supplement, and Part D (prescription drugs.) A premium is not considered an "out-of-pocket cost," in insurance language but, when comparing plans, of course you have to consider the monthly cost of the plan.



Deductible: This is the amount you pay before your insurance coverage begins. This is a little misleading because many services are now covered without the deductible. In other words, screenings, check-ups, etc. are health services not subject to deductible.

Many plans have a separate, lower deductible for medications. You should know both your medical and the drug deductible.

Copays: This is the amount you pay for any service, before or after deductible. Usually, there is a set copay for primary care doctor visits, another for specialists, one for basic services such as x-rays, and another for prescriptions. All of these copays are counted towards you maximum out-of-pocket costs, IF you stay "in network."

You know that going "out of network" costs you more for most services. But did you know that in most cases, dollars you spend out of network do not count towards your deductible, or your out-of-pocket maximum? This can greatly affect your annual out-of-pocket costs. It is almost always better financially to stay in network, even if it means traveling to a specialist or a facility that's further way. Of course, the quality of care and comfort level of the provider factors in here too. Those are hard to quantify and are a personal choice.

Knowing these terms, and what your potential costs might be, can help you budget for your healthcare.

The Trouble with Heartburn Medications

We've all experienced it – that burning, gurgling discomfort after certain meals. The common solution is to quench it with a proton pump inhibitor (PPI) such as Prilosec or Nexium – relief. Heartburn is a bother for many and is commonly diagnosed as gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD).

Our stomachs are well-suited to house lots of stomach acid, which is used to break down what we eat into useable nutrients (amino acids, vitamins and minerals, etc). Our esophagus is quite sensitive, by comparison, to acid. People who suffer from GERD experience small amounts of stomach acid creeping up into their esophagus, which can be very uncomfortable and sometimes painful.

PPIs block our stomach's ability to produce stomach acid, which can cause a decrease in *symptoms* associated with GERD and make people happier. The drawbacks, however, are significant. Without stomach acid, those proteins aren't broken down as well and can thus lead to a variety of vitamin and mineral deficiencies.

Research is now showing that long-term use of PPIs for heartburn and GERD may increase the risk of dementia, heart disease, and chronic kidney disease. Stomach acid helps break down food and it also functions as a barrier against various pathogens. When there's less acid, we become more vulnerable to things like clostridium difficile, pneumonia, and salmonella among many others.

So what can one do instead? The first thing would be to identify the foods and behaviors that trigger the symptoms. Often times overeating, eating before sleeping, not chewing your food, and eating fatty or greasy foods, caffeine, spicy food, alcohol, peppermint, and chocolate are on the short list of triggers.

Once you are aware of what exacerbate your symptoms, it is easier to choose not to suffer the heartburn aftereffects. Your GERD may also be the result of another underlying infection, H. pylori. Consult with your physician to help rule that, or other causes, in or out. PPIs may be effective for short-term symptom management, but use caution when you find yourself reaching for them on a regular basis.

The Difference Between a Will and a Trust

Many people have questions about the difference between a will and a trust, and when a trust may be necessary.

The Basic Facts About Wills

Very simply, a will states the wishes of a person upon their passing about how to distribute their property to heirs. The will also names an executor who oversees the process of distributing assets, as well as nominates a guardian to care for minor children. A will is only in effect after someone passes.

If a person's assets are over \$150,000 or there is real property involved when they pass, the Probate Court will be involved. Probate is rather lengthy, on average 18 months, and expensive: probate fees for a conservative estate of \$500,000 are over \$26,000.

How a Trust is Different From a Will

A properly funded living trust should avoid any court involvement when someone passes. A living trust is a more flexible "will substitute" which not only provides for asset distribution upon passing, but also includes instructions if someone cannot make financial decisions for themselves.

A trust is not only for the wealthy, but for anyone who wants their heirs to avoid court involvement and high fees, as well as anyone leaving assets to a minor child. When a trust is established, assets are held by you as trustee of your trust. Your assets are then managed according to your instructions during your lifetime and upon passing. Most trusts can be amended or revoked during your lifetime. A trust based estate plan offers a lot of flexibility and is widely used.

If I Already Have a Will, Why Would I Need a Trust?

Even if you have will, your current circumstances may require different estate planning strategies that can be accomplished with a trust.

In addition to the above, a trust can assist with:

- The care of minor children, with ongoing support amounts paid from the trust
- To care for individuals with special needs, without disrupting government benefits
- Real estate holdings can be managed and do not have to be sold during unfavorable market conditions

How An Attorney Handles A Major Dog Bite Case

In order to obtain a

settlement after being bitten by a dog, there is much more to be done than simply telling the dog owner you want to be compensated for your injuries.

After a dog bite or dog attack, we encourage our personal injury clients to discuss in detail the dog attack with the investigating officers in their home, if possible, and to walk with them to the scene of the dog attack.

It's important to have photos printed to show to the investigators the extent of the injuries. In serious dog bite cases, a victim's injuries will usually be bandaged up. An investigator is usually hesitant to ask a dog bite victim to unwrap their bandages. Insurance company adjusters will often ask to see photos of any remaining scars.

The attorney who fails to make every possible effort to reduce all of the medical liens, government liens and insurance liens does a real disservice to their client. As much time in preparing one's case for litigation, mediation or settlement can and should be spent by a dog bite attorney to reduce the dog bite victim's liens.

Even if a dog bite victim does not want to go through plastic surgery or scar revision treatment, it is helpful to their case to obtain estimated costs of such treatment to present in mediation.

In cases with significant scarring, it is important to obtain information from the dog bite victim's specialists describing not only the medical procedures that may be needed, but also the length of time such scars will be visible and to the extent to which they will be permanent. In the case of a child, a permanent scar can mean being teased by other school children and then even being shunned by others as an adult.

The number of dog bite injuries in California continues to rise each year. The more an experienced dog bite lawyer can do to guide their client to the best possible treatment, to document their injuries and their emotional impact, and then to reduce the medical and insurance liens, the greater the outcome will be for the client.

Caution: El Niño Floods and Your Car

As we all have been informed, El Niño is producing a wetter than normal season. If we do experience flooding, do not – under any circumstances – drive into standing water, and here is why:

For most vehicles, the air induction for the engine is located in the lower bumper area or grill area. What this does is supply air to the engine. That air combined with fuel, once compressed and sparked, is what makes your car go.

If water is sucked into that air induction, it fills your cylinders (along with other stuff) with water. The engine dies, the driver tries to restart the engine and just hears a click. That's because there is no place for the piston to travel because the cylinder has been filled with water.

If you do drive into standing water and your engine dies, do not try and restart. After you have called a tow truck, don't let him/her try and start your car. Have it towed directly to the shop of your choice and call your insurance company.

Most times if the car has not been attempted to be restarted, it can be salvaged. Otherwise, the insurance company will write you a check and take your car. So check the roads, and stay away from standing water by using alternative routes.

Low VOC: The name says it all. This type of paint contains fewer volatile organic compounds (VOCs), which release toxic gases. Opt for low-VOC paint if you want to go green in your home and deal with less paint fumes.

Checking For Leaks Can Help Water Conservation

Water is a critical part of California's way of life. Our economy, our environment and our day-to-day lifestyle need water to flourish. But our water is limited – especially during this historic drought.

The lack of rain and snow this winter means we have to stretch the water that we do have. Residents living in California can help out by repairing

plumbing issues early. Some common types of leaks found in the home include worn toilet flappers, dripping faucets and other leaking valves, swimming pools/spas and

irrigation systems. Here are some areas to check:

Toilets: Twenty percent of all toilets leak, often silently or at night. Look for drips - faucets, fixtures, hoses and plumbing in kitchens, bathrooms, laundry rooms and appliances.

Water Softeners: Check the salt reservoir. Increased salt use correlates to increased water usage, and may indicate a change in the regeneration schedule or a malfunction.


Water Heaters: These leaks are usually quite obvious and you will discover substantial amounts of water on the floor around your heater. Normally, the first sign of a heater problem is water dripping from the bottom of the jacket. This indicates that the tank has corroded through.

Irrigation: Look for broken sprinkler heads, missing emitters, cut drip lines and saturated areas. Check your irrigation schedule (length of time, number of days and stations).

Irrigation Valve Box: Listen for the sound of running water at the pressure regulator where the water line comes into the house. Look for drips at all outside plumbing and irrigation

Pools: Place a bucket on the top step of the pool and fill it with water about 4 inches from the top. Mark the water level inside and outside of bucket. After a day, if the water level in the pool is lower than the bucket, there probably is a leak in the pool structure or plumbing system.





- An irrigation system that has a leak 1/32nd of an inch in diameter (about the thickness of a dime) can waste approximately 6,300 gallons of water per month.
- A pool leak could total tens of thousands of gallons per year and potentially create further damage to the surrounding property.

overdoing it, and you can always add a touch of fun with colorful accents. Bold cushions or decorative pots can create a necessary pick-me-up to liven the space.




kinds of plants you're getting. Flowers that add color and texture are perfect for customizing your outdoor space, but they also have to be able to survive and thrive in the desert heat.


