partner with distributors, and service providers partner with referral sources – all in an effort to help their businesses thrive.



American Craft Week Slated for October 2-11 Participate & Enjoy!

to offer a diverse slate of arts and crafts activities to promote American Craft Week (ACW) — a national ten-day celebration of handmade craft that encompasses more than a thousand events in all fifty states. Weather Watch: Protecting Our City

El Niño is here...and La Quinta may be in for a very wet fall

through spring. To help reduce potential flooding, we are focused on maintaining storm drains and retention basins to function as designed to provide maximum flood protection to public roadways and public facilities.

The last substantial rainfall in La Quinta (September 8, 2014) was of a size the City had never seen before. The City's storm drains and retention basins are designed to handle what is commonly referred to as a "100-year" storm event, meaning a storm that has a one percent (i.e., 1 in a 100) chance of occurring in any given year. (That's why it's possible to have back-to-back 100-year storms). However, a 700-year flood was unforeseeable. Now that we've seen what it looks like, we are doing everything within our means to lessen the impact of another such storm and educate residents on what they can do as well.

Homeowners should clear rain gutters and check to make sure drains and swales around the home are clear to prevent water from being trapped on the property. Homeowners Associations also have some work to do - they should verify that their retention basins have been properly maintained within the past 12 months, including servicing of the drywells or sand filters located in the bottom of the basin.

Although we can't guarantee that Mother Nature won't give us more than we can handle, we can all be confident that we've done our part to lessen flood damage should we be faced with more torrential rainfall. Protecting our Gem of the Desert and everyone in it is of the upmost importance. Please visit our website at **la-quinta.org** for safety tips on being prepared for seasonal climate changes.

If you have any questions on how to best prepare your home or community from flooding, the Public Works Department would be happy to meet with you to discuss flood protection options.

PUBLIC WORKS AT WORK

Safety First on La Quinta Streets

Traffic collision data identified several intersections where broadside collisions were occurring due to drivers not complying with red lights. As a recommended safety upgrade, a second traffic signal head has been added on the mast arms of intersections that have three or more approach lanes. This upgrade is now complete at the intersections below, and broadside collisions are expected to decline:

- Highway 111 and Plaza La Quinta (Circle K)
- Highway 111 and Simon Drive
- Highway 111 and Jefferson Street
- Washington Street and Avenue 50
- Washington Street and Avenue 48
- Washington Street and Avenue 47

Roundabout Gets New Stripes

The roundabout at Jefferson Street and Avenue 52 was re-striped to provide a single lane entering the roundabout and a separate right-turn lane on all four

approaches. The signing and striping were upgraded to ensure drivers approaching the roundabout reduce their speed and select the appropriate lane when entering. Traffic is now flowing more smoothly and motorists and bicyclists have provided favorable comments about the single-lane operation.

Bicyclists, Just for You!

Maintenance staff has begun painting bicycle symbols at specific locations at the Avenue 52/Avenida Bermudas intersection to enhance bicycle detection by the City's traffic signal video detection system. The bicycle symbol designates the location for a cyclist to wait to be detected. The traffic signal video detection system has a special "bike" detector that can be programmed to distinguish between cyclists and vehicles, which allows the City to set a longer minimum green time specifically for cyclists. Public Works will be installing these symbols throughout the City at the intersections equipped with the video detection technology.

October is Fire Prevention month!

Are you doing everything you

can to prevent a fire in your home?
Each year, too many people die in
home fires that could have been
detected by working smoke alarms.
Many of these deaths happen at night
when people are asleep. Smoke alarms
need to be installed throughout the
home, including bedrooms and other
rooms where people sleep.

Hear the beep where you sleep!

"Hear the beep where you sleep" is the National Fire Protection Association's Fire Prevention Week theme for 2015, and it was chosen to remind people to have a working smoke alarm wherever they sleep. A working smoke alarm in sleeping areas increases the chances of escaping a home fire. Family members have a better chance of waking and getting outside quickly.

In the event of a home fire, how much time do you think you have to get outside safely? People may only have one to two minutes to escape once the smoke alarm sounds. This means it's important to hear the alarm as soon as it sounds and react quickly. If the smoke alarm is not near the sleeping area, it may take longer to wake someone and limit reaction time. In addition to the bedrooms, smoke alarms need to be present in any room family members typically sleep. If you doze on the living room sofa in the afternoon, there should be a smoke alarm close by.

Why are interconnected smoke alarms important? If the smoke alarm in one area of the home sounds, all of the interconnected alarms will also sound.

For example, if someone is sleeping on the second floor and the smoke alarm in the kitchen sounds, the smoke alarms on the second floor will also sound. This provides extra time to safely escape the home if there is a fire. If family members sleep behind closed doors, it's especially important to have interconnected smoke alarms so the alarm sounds in the sleeping area as early as possible.

Everyone in the home should know the sound of a smoke alarm. If the smoke alarm makes this sound: beepbeep-beep (pause) beep-beep-beep (pause) – get outside, stay outside and call 9-1-1 from outside the home. If there is someone in the home who does not hear well, investigate smoke alarm accessories to assist someone who is hard of hearing. These accessories use vibrations, flashing lights, or low-pitched sounds to alert people that the alarm is sounding. A smoke alarm can make another sound – a chirp. This is a sound that will happen every few minutes. It can be annoying, but it's telling you that you need to change the battery. Never ignore a chirping alarm. Replace the battery right away. Ask for help from a neighbor, relative, or even the fire department if needed.

Remember.

- Make sure your home has enough smoke alarms. (You need one on every level, and outside each sleeping area.)
- Test all your smoke alarms monthly by pushing the test button. Ask for help if you are not able to test your alarms.
- Replace smoke alarms every 10 years. Look on the back of the alarm for the date of manufacture.
- Interconnected smoke alarms provide the best protection.

Creating Smiles and "Aha!" Moments in the Classroom

Imagine this: You're seven years old and a Coachella Valley student. You've been told you have "special needs," but you're not sure what that means. You

know you're smart and you're eager to learn. Still, you're

pretty sure you view the world somewhat differently than other youngsters.

You have some learning challenges. Too many stimuli - noises, colors, movement, other people - can be overwhelming. You long for routine, predictability and quiet.

Fortunately, there are resources to help you make sense of the chaos that surrounds you. You're in a small class. Your teacher understands you. You're starting to connect with your classmates. Little by little, you're learning to cope with your world.

But more could be done. Federal law mandates that assistive technology devices be made available to students who could benefit from them.

There is a growing trend in the Coachella Valley:

- Desert Sands Unified School District serves 3100 special education students, while facing total expenditure reductions for fiscal years 2008/2009 through 2012/2013 equaling \$29.7 million.
- The Coachella Valley Unified School District was underfunded by \$26.5 million in the 2011-2012 school year while special education enrollment grew by 4%. Special education enrollment has been greater than that of general education.
- Palm Springs Unified School District has a student population of nearly 24,000 with approximately 10% receiving special education.

So, back to our young learner and his classmates...

What if Valley students had their own adjustable slant boards? They could make their own adjustments and place books, papers, and electronic tablets exactly where it best suited them.

An adjustable slant board was recently introduced to some Coachella Valley schools by the American Outreach Foundation (AOF). Made of acrylic Plexiglass and adjustable to 14 different positions, adjustable slant boards grasp the children's awareness and connect them easily to everyday activities in which they previously held little interest. Users report many benefits, including: improved visual motor skills; better support for holding pen/pencil properly; an easier-to reach work surface; and more effective visual tracking for reading. This low-tech, low-cost assistive tool has been well-received by students and educators.



Using adjustable slant boards might even bring some smiles to young faces!

Not Filing a Tax Return Can Be a Crime

Each year, many law-abiding citizens end up breaking the law. I'm not talking about getting the occasional traffic ticket. I'm talking about not filing a tax return.

Not filing a tax return is a criminal offense. It is also a criminal offense to not to pay your estimated taxes on time. Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 7203 states the penalty is \$25000 for individuals and one year in jail for each year not filed. The penalty rises is \$100,000 for corporations or limited liability companies.

One in ten people you know have not filed a tax return. Many of these same people have not filed several years of tax returns. This can happens in every profession – doctors, lawyers, accountants, business owners and even government employees. They come into my office every week.

If you're one of the ten, you have some options:

1. You are looking for a Tax Attorney, CPA or an Enrolled Agent that specializes in these types of problems. I don't mean a professional that files past years' tax returns. Tax laws change every year. Your professional must know the laws that apply to the year in question. Your professional must specifically handle the planning, preparation, filing and the consequences of submitting past years' tax returns;

- 2. You need to file these returns as soon as possible. Any year not filed is an open year and the clock on the statute of limitations is stopped;
- 3. You are going to need your tax records to create the information that gets reported on the tax return. For individuals, this could be W2s and 1099s. Your tax professional can get this information for you. For businesses, start with your bank statements and expand from there. If you don't have bank statements, you tax professional will have some other options.
- 4. You will need to review the results of each return prepared to develop a plan of action to handle the potential for audit and collection actions.
- 5. You will need to file these returns in separate envelopes in separate certified mailings (E-filing in not an option for past years.) If you haven't filed for more than six years, you will need to file the most recent six years (criminal statute of limitations) and review the rest as needed.
- 6. It takes about 45-60 days for the returns to be processed into the IRS computer system. This is when the clock starts running on all related statute of limitations: audit (or examination), assessment of tax, collection, referral for criminal charges.







The Masks We Wear: Exploring the Enneagram Test

During Drought, Skip Overseeding of Grass

Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD) is encouraging homeowners, HOAs, businesses and golf courses to skip overseeding this fall in response to California's historic drought and the state's mandatory conservation goals.

Overseeding has been a long-standing practice in the Coachella Valley, but it has been losing popularity due to the state's ongoing drought. For example, the following customers stopped overseeding in recent years while maintaining healthy and attractive grass:

- The City of La Quinta stopped overseeding a majority of the parks four years ago.
- Some golf courses, including SilverRock Resort, The Citrus, Rancho Las Palmas and all of the PGA courses have stopped overseeding most, or all, of the nonplayable areas.
- Sunnylands decided in 2014 not to overseed

approximately 43 acres of turf, including the fairways on the property's golf course. This year, plans are underway to forgo overseeding on the vast majority of the estate's property.

CVWD has historically increased customers' monthly water budgets for six weeks during October and November to help customers who increase their water use for overseeding avoid higher rates. However, due to the state's conservation mandates, that will not be the case this year.

Those who don't overseed with the cool-season grass can expect the warm-season grass (Bermuda) to go dormant during the cooler months. Infrequent irrigation is required to keep the roots from dying so that it will grow back when temperatures warm up.

Many people mistakenly believe that you need to use a lot of water to overseed grass. For those who insist on overseeding, CVWD urges you to do so in a way



that does not waste water using guidelines available at CVWD.org.

Other alternatives to overseeding including painting dry grass with a green colorant or converting grass to desert landscaping or artificial turf.

• With a Neighbor You Trust



The Affordable Care Act and Its Impact on Your Business

The year 2015 marks a milestone in the implementation of the Affordable Care Act. This year, applicable large employers will be subject to both the 1095-C reporting requirements and employer mandate penalties if they do not provide minimum essential health coverage to their full-time employees and dependents.

An applicable large employer has an average of 50 or more full-time equivalent employees. This total is

determined based on the average count per month in the prior year. Part-time employees are counted by hours worked, so part-time hours are grouped to determine full-time equivalents.

For owners who have only one business interest, the calculation will not be too difficult. However, business owners who own more than one entity may not be aware that they are subject to the IRS Controlled Group Rules under Section 414(b) and (c). Applicable large employer status is calculated based on the number of full-time equivalent employees between all businesses in the controlled group.

Determining whether your business is part of a controlled group is a complicated process:
Common ownership is applied when entities share at least 80% ownership in common and hold controlling interest—and this can consistent of up to five different partners owning just 20% each, or "family attribution"—in which spouses and children are automatically attributed interests owned by one family member.

An affiliated service group is created when a company is formed to provide services to another company and shares a common owner or partner. In certain

situations the ownership interest can be as low as 10% and the entities will still be considered related.

Management group rules come into play when the performing organization's principal business is the performance of management services on a regular and continuing basis to a recipient company. No common ownership is required to be considered a controlled group.

While the ACA requirements are a very important issue due to the large penalties that could be levied, it is also important to note that these controlled group rules also apply to fairness testing for pension plans, and that the IRS is looking at 401k and Simple IRA plans in controlled group situations.

If you think you might have a situation where the controlled group rules apply, make sure to consult with your CPA as soon as possible.
